## FEASTS: God's Appointed Times (Leviticus 23) Fulfillment in Christ & Prophetic Horizon

#### **Spring Feasts** — Fulfilled in Christ's First Coming

#### 1. Passover (Pesach) – Lev 23:5; Exod 12

- What it is: Remembering Israel's deliverance from Egypt by the blood of the lamb.
- In Christ: Jesus is explicitly called "our Passover Lamb" (1 Cor 5:7). His crucifixion occurred during Passover (John 19:14).
- Fulfillment: Fulfilled at the Cross the Lamb slain for the sins of the world (John 1:29).
- **Future/Millennial?** The sacrifice aspect is finished ("once for all" Heb 10:10). But the memorial meal may continue as remembrance (Luke 22:19), and Ezekiel 45:21 suggests a future **Passover remembrance** in the millennial Temple.

#### 2. Unleavened Bread (Chag HaMatzot) - Lev 23:6-8

- What it is: Seven-day feast removing all leaven (symbol of sin/corruption).
- In Christ: His sinless body lay in the grave; He was the Unleavened One (2 Cor 5:21).
- **Fulfillment**: His burial the "bread from heaven" without corruption (Acts 2:27).

• **Future?** Believers "keep the feast...with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth" (1 Cor 5:8). Symbolically continues in our sanctification.

#### 3. Firstfruits (Reshit Katzir) – Lev 23:9–14

- What it is: Offering the first sheaf of barley harvest, thanksgiving for new life.
- In Christ: Paul calls Jesus "the firstfruits of those who sleep" (1 Cor 15:20).
- Fulfillment: His resurrection on Firstfruits, the pledge of our resurrection.
- Future? Ongoing the full harvest (resurrection of believers) is still to come at His return.

#### 4. Pentecost (Shavuot, Feast of Weeks) – Lev 23:15–22

- What it is: 50 days after Firstfruits; a wheat harvest feast, with two leavened loaves waved before God. Later linked in Jewish tradition to Sinai/Torah-giving.
- In Christ: The Spirit was poured out at Pentecost (Acts 2). The two loaves (with leaven!) picture Jews and Gentiles made one in Messiah despite imperfection.
- Fulfillment: Fulfilled in the giving of the Spirit.
- Future? Continues until the full harvest of nations is gathered (Matt 24:14; Rev 7:9).

# □ Fall Feasts — Awaiting Fulfillment in Christ's Second Coming

#### 5. Trumpets (Yom Teruah / Rosh Hashanah) - Lev 23:23-25

- What it is: Day of trumpet blasts, awakening, preparation for judgment.
- In Christ: Associated with the final trumpet, resurrection, and gathering (1 Thess 4:16; 1 Cor 15:52).
- Fulfillment: Not yet fulfilled. Likely tied to Christ's second coming and resurrection.
- Future/Millennial? Will inaugurate His return, possibly rehearsed annually in the millennial reign (cf. Ezek 40–48 calendar).

#### 6. Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur) – Lev 16; Lev 23:26–32

- What it is: Solemn fast, priest enters Holy of Holies, blood for sins of Israel.
- In Christ: Jesus is our High Priest (Heb 9:11–12), entering once with His own blood. His atonement is already accomplished.
- Fulfillment: Fulfilled spiritually, but Israel's national atonement awaits: "In that day...they will look on Me whom they pierced" (Zech 12:10; Rom 11:26–27).
- Future? Yes final reconciliation of Israel, and possibly memorial Yom Kippur in millennial Temple (Ezek 45:18–20).

#### 7. Feast of Booths (Sukkot, Tabernacles) – Lev 23:33–43

- What it is: Joyful, week-long feast of harvest, living in booths to remember God dwelling with Israel in the wilderness.
- In Christ: "The Word became flesh and tabernacled among us" (John 1:14). Jesus identified Himself with the Sukkot water and light rituals (John 7-8).
- Fulfillment: Will be fulfilled in the Kingdom when God dwells with man (Rev 21:3).
- **Future/Millennial?** Explicit: "All nations...shall go up year after year to worship...and to keep the Feast of Booths" (Zech 14:16–19).
- **New Jerusalem:** ultimate fulfillment eternal dwelling of God with His people.

#### Other Commemorations (Post-Torah)

#### **Purim (Esther 9:27–28)**

- What it is: Celebration of deliverance in Persia.
- **In Christ**: Points to God's providential deliverance of His people.
- **Future?** Continues as a memorial; not prophetic in the same sense.

#### Hanukkah (John 10:22; 1 Macc 4:59)

- What it is: Festival of Dedication, Temple rededicated after Antiochus.
- In Christ: Jesus attended; He is the true Temple light (John 8:12).
- Future? Possibly honored as memorial, but not commanded in Torah.

### **Prophetic Timeline of the Feasts**

- Spring Feasts = Christ's first coming (fulfilled).
- Pentecost = Spirit age, ongoing.
- Fall Feasts = Christ's second coming, final judgment, restoration, kingdom.
- Millennial reign = at least Sukkot (Zech 14), possibly others as memorials (Ezek 45).
- New Jerusalem = ultimate Sukkot God dwelling with His people (Rev 21:3).

## Summary Verdict:

- Yes, we keep God's feasts fulfilled in Messiah, rehearsed today, prophetically pointing to His future work.
- Fulfilled: Passover, Unleavened Bread, Firstfruits, Pentecost.
- Future/Prophetic: Trumpets, Day of Atonement, Booths.
- Millennial: Sukkot (explicit), others possibly in Ezekiel's Temple.
- New Jerusalem: eternal Tabernacle of God with His people.
